### Geographical distribution

- Approximately one million people, or 9% of the total population in the Arctic is of indigenous heritage (Source: Nordregio)
- Arctic indigenous peoples include, for example, Saami in Circumpolar areas of Finland, Sweden, Norway and Northwest Russia, Nenets, Khanty, Evenk and Chukchi in Siberia, Aleut, Yupik and Inuit (Iñupiat) in Alaska, Inuit (Inuvialuit) in Canada and Inuit (Kalaallit) in Greenland. ### Collaboration goals

Our group aims to **build close partnerships with the Arctic indigenous organizations in order to get involved in each others activities and thus mutually benefit from each other.**

In doing so, we seek to:

1. Form partnerships with indigenous organizations that could help to set the priorities of the group;
2. Find mutual interests of future partnerships for shared benefits;
3. Design better strategies for building relationships with indigenous communities (to avoid complicated situations for/with researchers and individuals in the community);
4. Recruit young people and early career scientists (ECS) interested in becoming involved in the project group to guide Council members towards actions that would fulfill our partnership agreement and benefit indigenous communities as well as our membership;
5. Develop a guide on how to promote community-collaborative research projects, highlighting examples of success stories, as well as integrating events which give a voice to indigenous communities into our [International Polar Weeks](#)

### What is APECS?

The Association of Polar Early Career Scientists (APECS) is an **international and interdisciplinary organization** for students, postdoctoral researchers, early faculty, early career professionals, educators and others with interest in the **Polar and Alpine regions and the wider Cryosphere**. It aims to:

- **Create a network of polar researcher**
- **Provide the opportunity for career development**
- **Promote education and outreach**

APECS celebrated its 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2017. The current membership number in July 2019 is about 2873\* from 70 countries.
